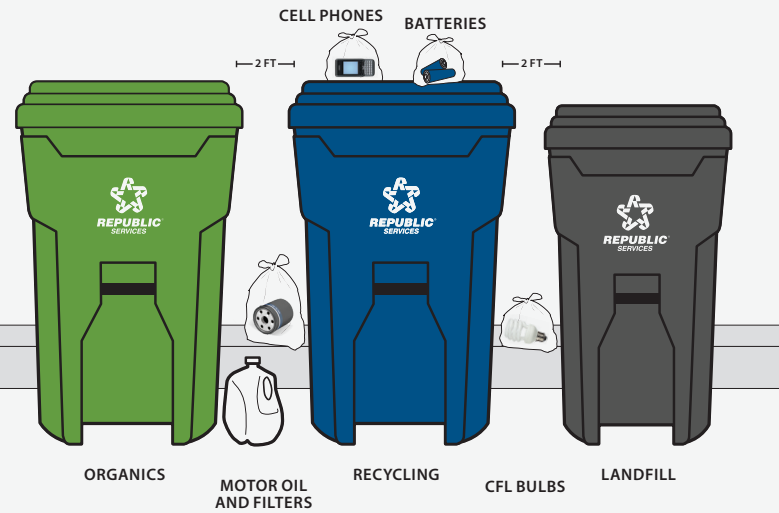


Cart Setout Instructions

Place carts out by 6am on your collection day. Set carts next to the curb and away from vehicles. Cart lids should be completely closed. Drivers have until 6pm to service.



Place all household batteries, cell phones, and compact fluorescent bulbs (CFL's) in a sealed plastic bag(s). Tape ends of Lithium-ion batteries. Place batteries and cell phones on top of the **blue recycling cart lid** and place bagged CFL's on the ground next to your **blue recycling cart** on your collection day.

Recycle Smart. Landfill Less.

You can upgrade your 64-gallon blue recycling cart and/or green organics cart to a larger 96-gallon size at no extra cost!

Free Extra Collection Services

- 1 on-call landfill collection annually
- 4 on-call collections annually for yard trimmings (in paper or compostable bags) and/or extra recyclables

Size and weight restrictions apply. There is a fee for large items. To schedule an extra collection call Republic Services at (925) 685-4711.

Reuse & Cleanup Days Program

Twice a year, single-family residents can place a variety of items at the curb for reuse, e-waste recycling, and disposal. Reuse Day (Day 1) items are picked up by Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery and Cleanup Day (Day 2) materials are serviced by Republic Services.

Most materials collected during your Reuse Day go to local charities in Contra Costa County. A brochure will be mailed with your Reuse Days dates at least two weeks in advance. For more information, visit RecycleSmart.org/Cleanup.

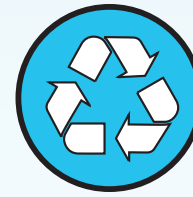
Empty, Clean and Dry Recycling



Empty. Remove any remaining food or liquid.



Clean. Lightly rinse or wipe the item.



Dry. Shake out excess moisture or air dry.

If your recycling or organics cart is contaminated with unacceptable materials, it may not be serviced and/or you may be charged.



It is **ILLEGAL** to put these items in your carts:

Motor Oil. Call Republic Services at (925) 685-4711 to request a used oil collection container. Then simply place your sealed container and oil filters next to your carts on your collection day.

Medical injection devices (sharps).

Free, local drop off locations.

Unused medications. Free, local drop off locations (including inhalers, pet and liquid medications).



E-Waste. Recycle electronics curbside on your bi-annual Reuse Day for free, or call Republic Services to schedule an e-waste pickup at the curb for a \$50 fee.



Paint and hazardous waste. Take paint, pesticides, solvents, personal care products, and other household chemicals **FREE OF CHARGE** to Central San's Household Hazardous Waste Facility. Visit CentralSan.org/HHW for information.

A Note About Observed Holidays: Only Christmas Day and New Year's Day affect collections. If the holiday falls on a week day, all collection on and after the holiday will be pushed one day later that week.

- Bundled Plastic Bags

- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Paper (If shredded, put in clear bag)
- Clean Cardboard

- Food Scraps
- Food-Soiled Paper and Containers
- Garbage
- Paper Towels
- Paper Plates
- Organics
- Wood
- Expanded Polystyrene Foam
- Hot Ashes
- Hazardous Waste
- Batteries
- Electronics
- Plastic Utensils

Recyclables should be loose (no bags) or placed in a clear bag only.



Organics

YES

- Small Twigs and Branches (4' or less in length and 6" in diameter)
- Yard Trimmings
- Uncoated Food-Soiled Paper (including napkins, paper towels, paper food cartons, pizza boxes)
- Raw and Cooked Food, Leftovers, To-Go Food
- Fruits and Vegetables (raw and cooked)
- Dairy Products
- Breads
- Meat and Seafood (including bones and shells)

NO

- Plastic
- Pet Waste
- Glass
- Metal
- Diapers
- Plastic Food Containers
- Compostable & Biodegradable Plastic
- Expanded Polystyrene Foam
- Treated Wood Waste

Organics should be loose (no bags) or in compostable or paper bags only.

Senate Bill 1383

Composting organics is now the law in California!

Organic material accounts for more than half of the material in California's waste stream. Greenhouse gas emissions caused by the decomposition of organic material in landfills contribute to global climate change. Starting January 1, 2022, residents are required to separate organics, including all food scraps, uncoated food-soiled paper and yard trimmings, for composting. Residents can participate by:

- Preventing food waste (reducing food waste generation)
- Backyard composting
- Using the curbside green organics cart



SB 1383 also requires local jurisdictions to monitor contamination and proper sorting of organics by performing annual route audits. RecycleSmart or its contractor may be in your neighborhood throughout the year assessing your carts.

Organics Programs



Residents can compost organics at home and/or use the curbside green organics cart.

Backyard composting is an easy process that turns yard trimmings and food scraps into a natural soil amendment to help grow healthy food. Visit [RecycleSmart.org/Composting](https://www.recycle-smart.org/Composting) for information on quarterly savings on your Republic Services bill, workshops and discounted compost bins.

Or, let Republic Services compost for you! Place organics in your green cart. A free food scrap pail is available to collect your scraps. Pails can be lined with newspaper, paper bags, or BPI-Certified compostable bags. Call Republic Services at (925) 685-4711 to request a pail. Important: Compostable plastics such as cold cups and utensils **do not break down** completely in our compost process. These should go in your **black landfill cart**.
