Rate Setting Process

- July August, 2021: Contractor's compensation and Authority expenses are calculated in accordance with the franchise agreement
- September, 2021: Preliminary contractor's compensation and rate impacts presented to Board
- October, 2021: Met with member agencies with final results and review rate adjustment strategies
- December, 2021: Preliminary rate adjustments presented to the Board
- January, 2022: Board approves final rates to be effective March 1








Diversion Rate Increases Since 2000-01 Baseline



Overall Measured Diversion Rate Based on Service Levels as of December 2021




