

Compostable plastic? Not so fantastic!

Compostable plastic is a wonderful idea in theory, but the technology is not quite there vet.

While the green stripe plastic cups and corn-based utensils may be biodegradable, **they are not compostable** under current composting facility operations. This means they are not engineered to break down quickly within the 45-day process limitation at most composting facilities.

Unfortunately these items belong in the landfill cart, and even so they won't break down in the landfill. They need air, moisture and sunlight to break down properly and landfills tend to mummify and deprive waste from these necessary elements.

Throughout the month of July consider **one change** to your daily routine to reduce your use of plastic.



Some alternatives to compostable plastic:

- Use reusable utensils, plates and cups
- Use uncoated paper materials (place in green organics cart)
- Use aluminum foil to wrap food
